SARA, Administrative Assistant, white female, 30s. Has attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD).	At first I used headphones to filter out noise. Then our team met and we were able to swap cubicles so that I was out of the main traffic area and away from the distraction of the printers and copy machines.
CAROL, Supervisory Wildlife Biologist, African-American female, 40s or 50s. Diagnosed with cancer and undergoing chemotherapy.	With all this new communications technology, I am able to supervise my field staff even when I need to work from home following chemo. The other day, one staff member used the digital camera in her phone to send me photos so I could help diagnose a problem.
JAVIER, PPQ Officer, Hispanic male, late 20s. Has recently started having seizures. (Shown with a service dog)	Before I had seizures, I had no idea that some service animals are trained to detect seizures before they happen. Rosie helps warn me of a seizure so that I can be safe. So, I just needed to be able to bring Rosie to work and have time to walk her.
ANNA, Program Analyst, Asian female, 50s or 60s. Is losing sight gradually due to macular degeneration.	My supervisor saw me struggling to see the screen. He contacted the TARGET Center and they got me a larger screen now and magnification software. It's changed my life. You can't believe what the TARGET Center can do.
LILY, IT Specialist, Hispanic female, early 30s. Army Reserve vet with symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) since returning from Iraq.	It turns out that I overreact to people coming up behind me without warning. So, all we had to do is reconfigure my office to allow my desk to face the entrance.
AARON, Microbiologist, African-American male, 40s. Has recently developed a sensitivity to a few of the chemicals used in the lab.	My accommodation ended up benefitting everyone in the lab. A new ventilation system was installed. In addition, I now have a specialized respiratory mask and take more frequent breaks.
