



The portal provides functionality to assist agencies with every aspect of the PIV credential lifecycle, including sponsorship, adjudication, credential production/activation, and credential maintenance.

Using the AI Portal, USAccess agencies will be able to enter applicant data into the online system, check status through the entire credentialing process, as well as gain access to a variety of post-issuance tools.
