# Finding learning just got a little easier!

In early 2023, Team AgLearn, conducted a usability survey to gain feedback and insight on improving the search functionality in the Find Learning area of AgLearn. The survey was conducted by Team AgLearn and we gathered more than 4,000 responses from AgLearn leads, admins, and end-users. Based on the survey results, Team AgLearn developed the following solutions to improve the Find Learning search experience making it more user-friendly and intuitive.

### • Course Catalog Cleanup

Directly from your feedback, this effort involves eliminating outdated courses and seminars from the AgLearn database in order to improve search results. With the help of leads and admins, we have made great progress with this effort and expect it will be an ongoing process to make sure everything stays up to date and current for learners.

### • Streamlining of the Filters Options With input from the survey we were also able to prioritize and streamline the number of filter options available limiting it to only the most relevant ones learners want to access.

## New Course Tags

This new feature is coming spring 2024, and is intended as an intuitive and streamlined way to group courses by topics and make searching for specific topics easier for learners. Initially, 20 Course Tags will be available.

# **Course Tags FAQs**


Want to know more about Course Tags? Read on to get answers to your questions.

#### **Q: What are Course Tags?**

**A:** Course Tags are keywords which are used to categorize or "group" courses and other content by topic or subject area.

# Q: Where are they located on the Find Learning page?

A: The Course Tags are located in a drop-down below the Find Learning Heading. The new streamlined filters are available in the Filters section.



## Q: How are Course Tags assigned?

A: When a course is created, the course creators will select and apply the appropriate Course Tag category and apply it to their course. This will enable it to appear in the search results. Course creators are not required to use Course Tags when creating a course. The standard filters and search tools will still be available to users.

# Q: How can Course Tags be added or changed?

A: To add or change a Course Tag, a Lead AgLearn admin will need to submit an AskAgLearnNow ticket requesting a change.
